

FOREIGN STUDENTS

Enrolment at the Academy of Fine Arts in Rome

Students who wish to enrol in Level I, Level II or Master's courses at the Academy of Fine Arts in Rome must take an admission test.

The admission test is required for all Level I and Level II courses and for Master's courses.

Non-EU students may only apply for admission to the course indicated in the pre-admission application to be submitted on the University portal (www.universitaly.it).

The admission exam procedures for each Diploma Course will be published on the Academy of Fine Arts website by the end of August (abaroma.it/eng/). In order to take the admission exams, candidates must apply online on the Isidata portal (www.isidata.net).

Requirements for enrolment

Foreign students applying for a visa must submit a **pre-enrolment application** on the University platform (www.universitaly.it), attaching the following documentation:

- Passport
- Declaration of value in loco (Issued by the Italian diplomatic representation in the country of origin)
- Qualification with certified translation into Italian

Students who do not submit a pre-enrolment application in the manner indicated will not be able to apply for admission and enrolment at the Academy of Fine Arts in Rome.

The pre-enrolment application is required to obtain an entry visa and does not replace the admission application.

To submit your application for admission to the entrance exam, visit isidata.net and select Student Services.

Italian language test

All non-EU and EU students (except those enrolled in the Turandot Project) are required to take an Italian language test.

The language test will be held in person.

Students who hold the following qualifications are exempt from the Italian language tests:

- Diploma in Italian language and culture obtained from the Universities for Foreigners of Perugia and Siena

- Certificates of Italian language proficiency, level B2 or higher, issued under the CLIQ (Certificazione Lingua Italiana di Qualità) quality system

Foreign students who do not pass the language exam will have the opportunity to attend the Foundation Course, an intensive six-month course in Italian language and culture, which will be held in person at the Academy of Fine Arts in Rome for a fee.

After passing the final Italian language exam, students will be able to take the admission exams according to the scheduled calendar.

If students do not pass the final B2 level language exam of the Foundation Course, they must leave Italy no later than the expiry date of their visa or study residence permit.

Scholarships

Foreign students may apply for a DiscoLazio scholarship in accordance with the procedures set out in the DiscoLazio Call for Applications, which is usually published in June on the website <http://www.laziodisco.it/>
